

HOW CAN CONSERVATION HELP THE MONARCH?

WHY THE MONARCH IS ENDANGERED

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service declared the monarch butterfly species endangered in December 2024 and is proposing protection for one of the nation's most beloved species. With its notable orange and black markings, the monarch butterfly is one of the most recognizable insects in the world. In North America, monarchs are grouped into two long distance migratory populations. The eastern migratory population is the largest and overwinters in the mountains of central Mexico. The western migratory population primarily overwinters in coastal California.

ACCORDING TO THE U. S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE'S MOST RECENT SPECIES STATUS ASSESSMENT, THE EASTERN MIGRATORY POPULATION IS ESTIMATED TO HAVE DECLINED BY APPROXIMATELY 80 % SINCE THE 1980S.

The western migratory population has declined by more than 95% since the 1980s, putting its populations at greater than 99% chance of extinction by 2080. The probability of extinction for eastern monarchs ranges from 56-74%.



WHAT THREATENS THE MONARCH?

Threats to monarchs include loss and degradation of breeding, migratory and overwintering habitat; exposure to insecticides; and the effects of climate change. Urbanization, industrialized large scale farms, and drought conditions have also impacted milkweed populations. Although many people have already helped contribute to monarch conservation, additional habitat and protections are needed to ensure the species' longevity for future generations.

Monarch butterflies are more than just beautiful creatures with their vivid markings and bright orange color, they are also important pollinators. As they fly from flower to flower feeding on nectar, monarchs pollinate many types of wildflowers. They choose brightly colored flowers that grow in clusters and have flat surfaces that serve as landing pads for their tiny guests. Some examples of native Missouri plants that the adult monarch butterflies pollinate include but not limited to: Echinacea purpurea purple coneflower, Native Monarda - Bee Balm / Bergamot, Rudbeckia fulgida – Black Eyed Susan, Solidago drummondii -Goldenrod, and Symphyotrichum novae - angliae - New England Aster.

THE SOLUTION: MILKWEED

However, there is one plant that is essential for monarchs — milkweed. Adult female butterflies lay their eggs on milkweed, and when the caterpillars hatch, they eat the leaves and other plant parts.

At Garden Heights, we are an active participant in trying to save the monarch butterflies. We will have a few different milkweeds available throughout the season including Butterfly milkweed with its bright orange flowers, Common milkweed, Swamp / Marsh milkweed, and Whorled milkweed. Along with the Missouri native milkweeds, Garden Heights will have many native Missouri companion perennials the adult monarchs are attracted to and pollinate.

EARLY SPRING FERTILIZING

Spring is the time when your lawn begins to wake up from its winter dormancy. To help your grass green up quickly and grow strong, apply a slow-release, nitrogen-rich fertilizer. 
