
GET JUICED ABOUT CITRUS!

During the darkest days of winter, imagine being welcomed home by the heavenly scent of citrus. abloom with the promise of brighter, fruitful days to come. Indeed, most varieties fully ripen in winter, just when we most desperately need a boost. But lemonade in the winter? Do not despair; these vitamin-packed delights are readily stored for many months. You can still enjoy homemade Key lime pie in July.

We are already carrying: Meyer Improved lemons, Persian limes, Kumquats, Limequats, and Calamondins. In the Spring, look for the above mentioned in tree-form and in many sizes. In addition, look for Washington Navel and Moro Blood oranges, Kaffir and Mexican (Key) limes, Clementine tangerines, Eureka lemons and Rio Red grapefruit. We hope to find Australian Finger limes, Minneola tangelos, and Owari Satsuma mandarins.

To ensure your success, consider transplanting your citrus in Espoma Cactus Soil. For your year-round fertilization needs, we suggest Espoma Citrus Tone. You may also give them a boost with Espoma Fish Fertilizer.

Pruning after harvest is strongly encouraged. Always use bypass pruners. We carry Swiss-made Felco pruners and a lightweight pair by Joshua Roth. Lastly, be vigilant scouting for potential



insects. Citrus is primarily attacked by scales and spider mites. Fortunately, we have two organic pesticides which have proven effective in their eradication. Try either Bonide

Horticultural Oil or Bonide Neem Oil. Stop by the greenhouse today and we'll set you up for success. Orange you glad you read this?

CHINESE ASTILBE PERENNIAL

(Astilbe Chinensis) Shade perennial. Graceful, fernlike mounds of foliage. Plume-like flower panicles in shades of white, pink, raspberry or red in early summer. Best when planted in groups. Deer and rabbit resistant.

TALL GARDEN PHLOX PERENNIAL

(Phlox Paniculata) Sun perennial. Long blooming, fragrant blossoms. Available in shades of white, coral, lavender, pink, red, and violet. New, mildew resistant varieties. Loved by hummingbirds and butterflies.

PURPLE CONEFLOWER PERENNIAL

(Echinacea Purpurea) Missouri native. Daisy-like purple petals surround a large orange center. Long blooming and easy to grow in full sun or part shade. Loved by birds and butterflies.

LITTLE BLUESTEM PERENNIAL

(Schizachyrium Scoparium) Ornamental Missouri native grass. Slender, green-blue foliage with purplish-bronze flowers in August. Foliage turns a beautiful bronze in the fall. Very tolerant of heat and humidity. 2-4 feet tall.

STAFF PICKS FOR 2020

We've rounded up some of our favorite plants to keep an eye out for this growing season!

PENTAS ANNUAL

(Pentas Lanceolata) Sun-loving. Perfect for ground and containers. Blooms all summer long. Available in red, white, pink, and purple. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and bees. Relatively deer resistant.

BEETS/BEET ROOT VEGETABLE

(Beta Vulgarius) Colorful, tasty, vegetable that is packed full of nutrients. Easy to grow and easy to sow. Cool weather crop for Spring and Fall. Amend soil with compost.

PINEAPPLE SAGE HERB

(Salvia Elegans) Herb with great aroma. Patio-perfect and ornamental. Red bloom attracts hummingbirds and butterflies and can be used as a cut flower. A culinary cousin to mint.

'LITTLE QUICK FIRE' HYDRANGEA SHRUB

(Hydrangea Paniculata 'Little Quick Fire') Compact dwarf with exceptional sun tolerance and overall hardiness. Impressive, large pure white flowers in summer lead to a blush pink by early fall as nighttime temperatures become cooler. Prune in late winter.

SNAKE PLANT HOUSEPLANT

(Sanseverias) Houseplant for low to high light with bold, sword-like foliage. Known for ease, evening aircleansing capacity, and resilience.

CHINESE EVERGREEN HOUSEPLANT

(Aglaonemas) Houseplant for low to moderate light available in a wide variety of colors and patterns. Known for ease and all-day air cleaning capacity.

LADY PALM HOUSEPLANT

(Rhapis Excelsa) Small fan palm for low to high light areas indoors. Known for ease, cold tolerance, highly trafficked areas, and texture.



HELLO HELLEBORES!

Hellebores are one of our favorite shade perennials here at Garden Heights Nursery and with good reason. Who can resist a plant that greets you with beautiful late winter blooms and continues flowering well into May. These harbingers of spring are tough, cold-hardy, deer and rabbit resistant and are very easy to grow. The evergreen foliage remains attractive year-round and provides multi-season interest in the garden.

There are several species of hellebores and many have been interbred in recent years, producing countless hybrids in a rich array of colors and forms. Hellebores now come in virtually any color you desire: white, green, pink, apricot, yellow, purple, red and near black. Some have beautiful picotee edges or veining and many have spotted or dark centers that draw your eye into the flower.

At Garden Heights we bring in the bulk of our hellebores in early spring so that you can buy them in bloom. This spring we will have several new varieties including:

- Ruby Wine- Cup-shaped single flowers in shades of red and burgundy.
- Moondance Large pure white flowers. Silver veined marbled foliage.
- Sunshine Ruffles Sunny yellow double blooms with red edges.
- Ice and Roses Pink- Icy pink upward facing blooms. Dark green foliage.

It is time to say goodbye to winter and hello to hellebores! See you soon!
